

HOW TO GET TO the School of Veterinary Medicine in OZZANO EMILIA from BOLOGNA



The address of the School of Veterinary Medicine is: Via Tolara di Sopra, 50 40064 Ozzano dell'Emilia BO – Italy. The School is located in the periphery of Ozzano dell'Emilia and is 12 km from the centre of Bologna.

How to reach the School of Veterinary Medicine:

BY CAR

From Bologna driving on "via Emilia" in direction south-east;

From the motorway A14 exit BOLOGNA-San Lazzaro di Savena, at the exit turn to the left and take via Caselle and, immediately after, turn to the right to proceed on the "COMPLANARE SUD" till the exit of Ozzano Emilia - Ponte Rizzoli; in the roundabout take the direction Ozzano-Via Emilia, in the next roundabout take the right on "Via Emilia" and after 200m turn to the left following the indications for the School of Veterinary Medicine (Dipartimento di Scienze Mediche Veterinarie).

BY TRAIN

Line Bologna-Imola: trains every 30' (grossly at 5 and 35 minute of each hour) from 06,00 to 24,00. Please, be aware that the railway station in Ozzano is located outside the village, approximately 2,5 km from the PHI HOTEL EMILIA. Taxi connection is not easy.

BY BUS

Line 90C from Piazza Cavour direct line to the School of Veterinary Medicine; Line 101 from the Bus station every 30 minutes.


BANKING & SHOPPING HOURS


Logistic information for candidates at Nottingham:

The exam site on the Campus of Nottingham Veterinary School is 40 minutes' walk from local hotels in Kegworth, or there will be parking available on campus.

Entry on campus:

In order to get onto campus you should use the South entrance which is on Landcroft Lane. If you approach the barrier there is a button to press to speak with security. If you inform them you are going to the Vet School they will open the barrier. The vet school building is the first on the right





Parking:

Parking on campus is controlled by the University and you will need to collect a parking permit each day from the vet school reception. Finding spaces on campus can be difficult at busy times and car sharing from your accommodation is advised.

Entry into Vet School:

The main entry is just past the horsebox. There is a doorbell to the right of the door which you may need to press for entry.



The exam room:

Catering/lunch:

The student canteen on campus serves a selection of hot food daily from 12-1.30 and some salads. There is a small convenience store and coffee shop on campus within 50m of the Vet School, which also serves a limited selection of sandwiches and cakes.

Exam Format

Short answer questions

The examination is 3 hours and consists of 17 (20 mark) questions based around a theme. Neuroanatomy (embryology, applied and structural neuroanatomy), neurophysiology (including neuroanaesthesia), neuropharmacology and different aspect of clinical neurology (including treatment and diseases and clinical trials) of small and large animals will be examined in this section. Question format may comprise: extended matching questions (EMQ), tabulated answers, complete the sentence, true/false, and short answers.

MCQ

This will last 120 minutes and consists of 75 questions. Candidates will be asked to select the best answer for a question from four options. Each question will represent 1.33% of the total mark of this section. All areas of neurology and neuroscience may be examined in this section.

Case-based questions

There will be two x 2 hour papers each consisting of 5 cases (20 marks). These will amalgamate previous parts of the exam and will include videos, gross pathology and histopathology, different imaging modalities and electrodiagnostic studies centered around an individual case. Not all aspects will be included in each case. This will also focus on pathogenesis of disease and ability to choose appropriate diagnostic tests. It is important to note that this is **A NO RETURN EXAM** meaning that once an answer has been submitted you will not be able to change it.

Neuro-imaging

This will last 120 minutes and consists of six (20 mark) clinical cases and four (20 mark) theoretical questions. It will examine the candidates' abilities to recognize, describe and interpret lesions (anatomical level, orientation, type of imaging modality used, lesion characteristics), list special anatomical landmarks and to form a differential diagnostic list and main diagnosis. Four theoretically based questions on imaging will also be included. Candidates are expected to know basic imaging features in small and large animals. Basic knowledge is defined as what is included in general diagnostic imaging textbooks and articles. Question format may comprise: EMQ, tabulated answers, complete the sentence, true/false, and short answer.

Neuropathology

This will last 90 minutes and consists of ten (10 mark) clinical cases. Questions provide some background information on the case and use gross (macroscopic) and histopathological (microscopic) images of the central nervous system, peripheral nervous system and muscle tissue. You may be asked to interpret images (describe pathological changes), outline the pathogenesis, state additional diagnostic tests, provide pathological/morphological and/or the aetiological possibilities. Question format may comprise: EMQ, tabulated answers, complete the sentence, true/false, and short answer.

Electrodiagnostics

This will last for 90 minutes and consist of three (20 mark) questions. It will examine the candidates' abilities to perform an electrodiagnostic exam, their knowledge of the underlying electrophysiological events that generate common waveforms, their interpretation of normal and abnormal waveforms and their ability to form differential diagnoses from these tests.

Video based practical questions

This will last 90 minutes and consists of 5 (12 mark) questions with several videos of clinical cases. The main emphasis is on lesion localization and assessing the most likely differential diagnosis or diagnoses. Question format may comprise: EMQ, tabulated answers, complete the sentence, true/false, and short answer.
